It's simple, all you need to do is print and cut out the treasure (laminare, if you wish) and follow our steps to create a fun-filled day for everyone!

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Outdoor treasure hunt

For an outdoor treasure hunt, all you need to do is print and cut out our yellow artwork (lamine if you can) and pop them somewhere secret.

This treasure hunt is designed for one year group to do at a time. Get students into groups (we recommend groups of four to six) and set them loose to find the yellow.

When a yellow item is found, students need to write down where they found it next to the item on the worksheet. If you like, you can place clues next to each item to help students know where to go next. Who doesn't love a clue?!

On the next page, you will find some pre-written clue cards and some blank clue cards – you can use these for inspiration and to write your own clues.

TIP

Once everybody is in their groups, give each group a different clue so that they all head off in different directions.

Indoor treasure hunt

Rainy day? Only a little time to spare? You can also do this treasure hunt indoors in your very own classroom. All you need to do is print off as much of our artwork as you'd like and hide it around your classroom. Split students into groups of two to four and set a time limit (10-20 minutes should do). The challenge is to go around the classroom, and count all of the yellow treasure that they can find and add it all up at the end. The group closest to the actual number are the winners!

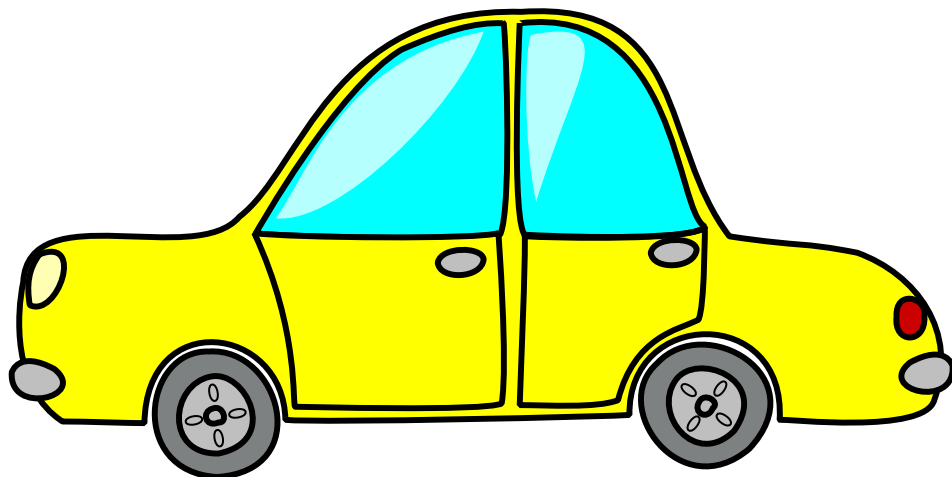
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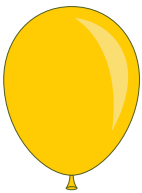
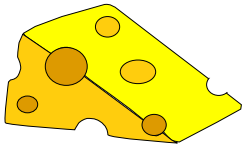
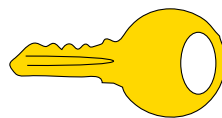
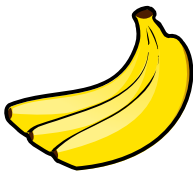


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TREASURE HUNT WORKSHEET
