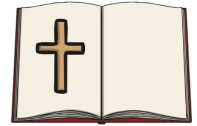

The Sermon on the Mount

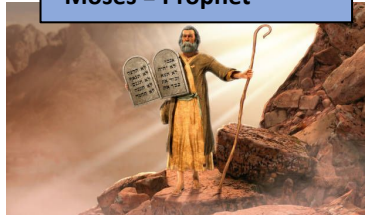
Jesus taught his followers to live by a higher standard than most:

Key Skills

How can we develop our RE skills?

- Identify messages in religious stories: Jesus taught his followers to be kind and loving towards all, including people who are unkind or dishonest
- Link stories together to identify messages: **show love and kindness to all**
- Understand this as 'Christian Love'

Key Vocabulary

How can I use these words in my lessons?

Vocabulary	Definition
Sermon	A talk with a moral of religious meaning
Prophet	A special messenger chosen by God
Ten Commandments	Rules / laws received by Moses now followed by Christians
Petitionary Prayer	A prayer which asks God for something
Agape	Christian love; unconditional love; love for all
Unconditional love	Love without limits / conditions
Conditional love	Love that depends on other factors
Testament	The Bible is split into the Old and New Testament
Atheist	A person who does not believe in the existence of God
Agnostic	A person who believes the existence of God cannot be proved/ disproved
Benevolent	A loving and forgiving God
