Polytheism =

Convert =
A person who changes their religion or worldview

- Islam grew in Mecca when Muhammad began preaching and some people converted their faith
- Some converts were tortured because of their decision
- Wealthy merchants opposed Muhammad at first

The story of The Saving of Bilal is an example of this.

Muhammad and Utba's Offer

- Wealthy merchants sent Utba to speak to Muhammad to tell him to stop preaching in return for money, fame and power.
- Muhammad refused the offer.
- Utba told the merchants to leave Muhammad alone after he refused the offer.



Muhammad and his followers left Mecca and moved to Madinah. The goal was to stop violence that often broke out there and to build a Muslim community. Three battles were fought and Muhammad helped to bring peace.

The Qur'an permits Muslims to fight if they have been wronged and to defend themselves under attack.

The Day of Judgement

- Muslims believe that Allah will determine whether they deserve to enter heaven or hell based on their choices in life.
- Some Muslims will be 'saved' and able to enter 'paradise'
