Religious Stories:

- Link this to Agape (found in the NT) and Christian unconditional love
- Compare this with conditional love

Vocabulary	Definition
Agape	Christian love Unconditional love
Conditional love	Love with limitations, depending on other factors
Unconditional love	Love without limitations
Commandment	An instruction, being told to do something
WWJD?	What would Jesus do? A method many Christians use for making moral decisions, following Jesus' teachings and the example he set
The Oral Tradition	The theory that before Biblical stories were written down, they were passed on only verbally
